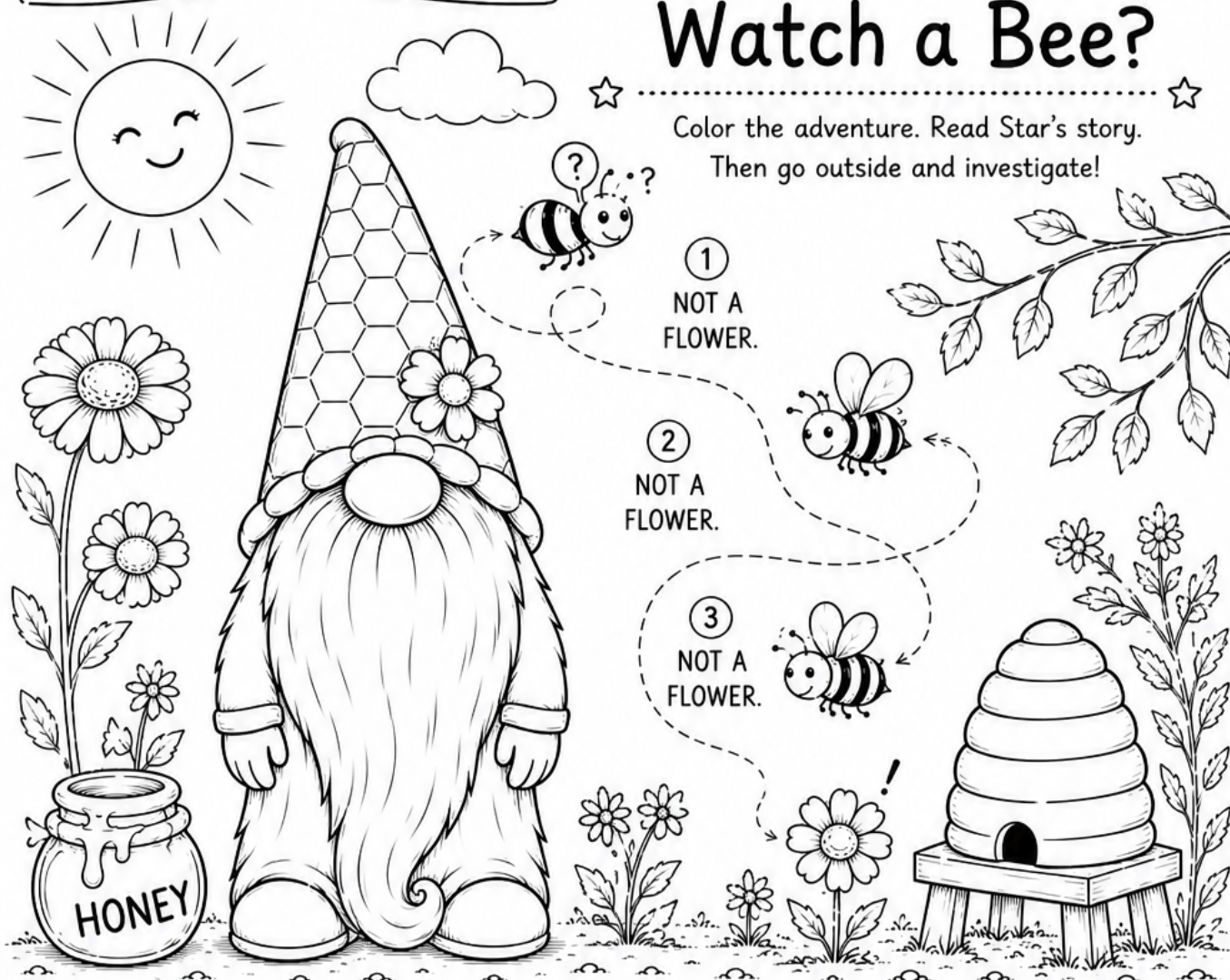


How Do You Watch a Bee?

Find a flowering plant with a

Eyes open.
Body still.



What does the bee do
when nobody bothers her?

Bees and wasps aren't
all the same, though.
Some stinging insects,
especially yellowjackets,
can be a little rude,
especially around food
or their homes.

So Star's rule is simple:
Watch quietly.
Give them space.
Never touch.

If you're not sure what kind
of buzzing visitor you've found,
ask a grown-up and observe
from farther away.
